

Planning for good health

- **1. Right away -** take out Pet Health Insurance and get the nutrition right from the start start with Hill's Science Plan Kitten then Hill's Neutered Cat Young Adult.
- **2. At 9 to 12 weeks** Primary Vaccination course. Start worming and flea prevention and keep these going for life.
- **3. After Vaccination** start regular Health Check with the nurse every 4 6 wks up to 12 months of age. Our nurses will help guide you through your kitten's development, toilet training and the best preventive health care.
- **4. At 5 to 6 months** Neutering and identichip.

☐ FLEA PREVENTION Do it all year round!				
Treat all your pets! Cost for 12 months for a cat is £65 - £80.				
The most effective method for a cat, because you won't forget to do it				
is PROGRAM injection - every 6 months!				
or use STRONGHOLD spot-on monthly				
□ NEUTERING is recommended at 5 - 6 months.				
☐ idENTICHIP - Electronic ID - do it today - lasts for life.				
☐ FELIWAY Plug-In Diffuser - to help you kitten settle in and to				
help calm your other cats. Use FELIWAY Spray for relaxed car travel.				
☐ TEETH CARE - feed a quality dry food like Science Plan.				
+ Annual dental polishing under anaesthetic from 3 years of age.

Cat walks in garden....

- One flea jumps onto cat.
- Flea lays 1000 eggs that scatter around the house!
- Eggs form into adult fleas in ~ 2 4wks.
- One flea can result in 1000 fleas in 4wks



Wise pet owners prevent flea infestation by regular flea prevention with vet products that really work and are safe.

- Use PROGRAM (6 monthly injection) works best because you don't have to remember to apply it!
- or use STRONGHOLD spot-on monthly.
- Treat all your dogs and cats all year round!

Most Costly Mistakes

- 1) If you don't insure your cat's health you may have costs up to £1000 £2500 for serious injury or disease.
- 2) If you feed canned food, small tubs or sachets you may be paying 2 3 times as much for a poorer quality food.

Biggest Health Mistakes

- 1) Obesity overweight cats have more medical problems.
- 2) Not neutering neutering prevents a host of problems.
- 3) Neglecting dental care bad teeth cause ill health.
- 4) Not vaccinating against fatal diseases.
- 5) No identification use a Cat Collar with a name tag.

Even if your cat has an Identichip you still need to use a cat collar as a clear indicator that this cat is not a stray! Put your name, address and phone no. on one side and "VET 01254 53622" on the other side. Our phone is always answered even if you are away. Your cat will be returned to a safe place even if you are not at home. Our nurse will show you how to fit a cat collar safely.
